### **Update on allotted policy tasks**

Policy Coly 1 (Woodland groups) – Colin Pady-16 sites identified, 1 cider orchard, none less than 2 acres. Sites to be named, numbered and EDDC to be asked to produce a map covering sites

Policy Coly 3 (Recycling) – Helen Parr – present sites listed. As the revised kerbside recycling is proving a success EDDC are going to consult on the removal of the “bring” banks such as those at Umborne Bridge

Policy Coly 4 (Local Green Space) – Robert Griffin/Steve Selby –Possible sites had been identified in Colyford

Policy Coly 5 (Green Wedge) – Robert Griffin/Steve Selby – agreed to go with the Rockbeare policy

Policy Coly 7 (Ceramtec Site)– Stephen Real/Caroline Collier – meeting to be arranged with HCA to help in formulating positive policy

Policy Coly 14 (School traffic) – Carol Rapley - proposed going with proposed policy

Policy Coly 15 (Public parking) – David Page –A meeting had been arranged for 10 May business and local residents invited

Policy Coly 16 (Community Horticulture)– Colin Pady – possible site for allotments in Colyford had been identified

Policy Coly 17 (Sport & Recreational facilities) – Helen Parr/Elaine Stratford – a list of facilities was being compiled, feed back awaited from some organisations
