## **APPENDIX A**

### **Covid vaccinations begin at Seaton Hospital**

I very much welcome the vaccinations of over-80s which began in mid-December, and am very pleased to see Seaton Hospital being used for this purpose.

### **Health Scrutiny review declines to approve CCG plans for removing services from Teignmouth community hospital**

I took part in a Spotlight Review by the Health and Adult Care Scrutiny Committee of the Devon CCG's proposals to remove services from Teignmouth Community Hospital, following a consultation. The review's conclusions are below. The CCG subsequently decided to go ahead with the proposals and the Committee will now have to decide whether to refer them to the Secretary of State for examination by the Independent Reconfiguration Panel. Members do not believe that the consultation, from the evidence presented, offers a credible case for change that both clinicians and residents advocate. Co-production is not visible in this consultation and it could not be described as an open collaborative approach. Members cited four examples. 1. The CCG heavily determined the questions for the survey (many of them closed) carried out by Healthwatch. 2. The online meetings were not set up to encourage inter-active conversation on the issues. The technology of Microsoft Teams or Zoom to go into breakout rooms was not utilised. 3. Patient experience does not feature in the evaluation of options process. 4. A key concern of many residents about the merits or demerits of rehabilitation within a hospital or care home setting were not presented. The proposed change is based on the CCG's belief that the quality of services would be maintained and that capacity of community intermediate home-based care is and will continue to be so effective thus making rehabilitation in a hospital setting redundant. During the scrutiny review members noted that although the CCG has been rolling out this model in other parts of the County, there is no systematic evaluative research co-produced by clinicians, professionals, and service users that presents clear evidence of success (using both quantitative and qualitative methodology) to support this extensive change proposed.

### **Re:Store Christmas Cheer campaign**

Seaton-based community group, Re:store, is delivering 108 food hampers to families from 10 schools in 7 local towns and villages, with vouchers and book gifts for 185 children, based on a successful crowdfunding campaign and support from local authorities and businesses. I was pleased to give £1500 towards this from my Locality Budget.

### **Locality budget**

New grants have been made to The Gateway, Beer Mens Shed and Branscombe Parish Council. I remain open to applications, with almost £1200 remaining for 2020-21.
